THE PLAYING FIELD

A meeting on the Playing Field was held recently to resolve a number of issues brought to the Parish Council meeting by our PCSO Karen Broad and a number of teenagers. Complaints had been made about the teenagers' use of the Playing Field but members were keen to stress that the Playing Field is just that - for playing on and that it had provided a meeting point and other equipment especially for teenagers.

None of the residents who attended had any complaints about the behaviour of the teenagers. The teenagers said they would like to use the meeting point more but asked if it could be enclosed on three sides to make it a bit more weather proof. The Council will investigate this as well as the possibility of providing solar lighting. The Council will also look at providing seats for the hang glider which was too high for most to use and to provide goal posts to replace those that were removed, although not in their original location.
